## West Virginia Wilderness Camp Supply List

A good way to pack is to use a plastic tub or tote.

Your Bible, a notepad, pen/pencil
Sleeping bag, pillow, maybe an extra blanket: It can get very cool at night.
Air mattress or sleeping pad: The ground is hard.
Flashlight, extra batteries
Trash bags, at least two: One is for dirty clothes, the other is for wet/muddy caving clothes.
Enough clothes for 5 days
Sweatshirts, maybe a jacket: It can be very cool at night and first thing in the morning.
Shoes: Bring at least 2-3 pairs for shoes, they will get wet. Sturdy tennis shoes are needed for rappelling.
Sturdy shoes are needed for caving (will get wet and muddy). Flip-flops are okay around camp and are
recommended for showering, but not for any activity.
Modest swimsuit and dark t-shirt to cover: Both girls and boys must wear t-shirt.
Rain gear: Water proof jacket, poncho, etc: We pray for good weather, but keep on going regardless.
Caving clothes: Long pants, long-sleeved shirt: Synthetics are best, cotton is not because it holds water and
you will get wet in the cave. Wool socks are great, your feet will get wet and wool will keep your feet warm. I
is about 55 degrees inside the cave. Toboggan (optional). Solid shoes as you will be climbing over rocks. Try
Goodwill or second-hand stores for great buys!
Cave gear: Knee pads (climbing on rocks), elbow pads (optional), gloves (good choice are the cheap ones
with the rubber on the palms/fingers), old back pack (for your lunch and water inside the cave; waterproof, if
possible). This pack will get wet and muddy!
White water clothes: Modest swimsuit with a dark t-shirt over it are required. Water shoes or old tennis
shoes: These will get wet!
Old pack: for carrying your personal stuff during the day. An old book bag is great. This is <i>not</i> the
same pack you carry in the cave!
Reusable Water bottle
Personal toiletry items (soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc): There are pit toilets at the camp site
and running water. Showers are a short hike so bring something to carry your stuff.
Bug spray
Towels, wash cloths: <u>BRING MORE THAN ONE!</u> Most of the time it is hard to get towels dried out on a
clothesline.
Camera (not required)
Lawn chair: RECOMMENDED! We sit around the camp fire. If you don't bring a chair, you wind up on the
ground. Put your name on it!
Medication you need to take: Please give it to the camp nurse.
Money for two fast food lunches: One on the way down, one on the way back. Extra money for a snack; if
we stop on our adventures, is okay as well.

## THINGS NOT TO BRING

CD/DVD player, radio, video gamer, cell phones, IPods, etc Any weapon of any kind Clothing with any inappropriate message or pictures Revealing or tight fitting clothing-NO UNDERGARMENTS SHOULD BE VISIBLE Shorts shorter than fingertip length Drugs, alcohol, tobacco Tents (we supply tents and ground cloths and tarps)
