CAMP RULES FOR CAMPERS

Because Wakatomika Christian Service Camp is a youth camp program and ministry, it is important to act and dress as Christians, following the example of Jesus Christ.

--Revised January 17, 2023--

THE FOLLOWING ARE CAMPER RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE CAMP BOARD:

- Report directly to the dean upon arrival.
- No one is permitted to leave the camp premises without permission from the Dean.
- Campers must park their cars and give the keys to the dean. Vehicles may only be driven by camp staff who are licensed drivers
- One camper should not go off alone. Follow the rule of threes.
- Obscene, vulgar, or sexually suggestive language or gestures are not allowed.
- Campers are expected to be respectful of one another and staff members.
- Campers are not permitted in the kitchen.
- After 11:00 p.m., no admittance in the cafeteria is permitted without permission of the dean.
- Pets are not permitted on camp grounds.

Campers may NOT bring the following to camp:

- Electronic devices including, but not limited to cell phones, apple watches, personal audio or video devices, personal computers, or video games.
- Weapons of any kind; including pocket knives.
- Any form of drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products.
 - Prescription & over-the-counter drugs must be given to the first aid attendant at registration. The first aid attendant will determine if the camper needs to retain medications, such as in cases of severe allergy or asthma.

Proper dress is required to be worn by campers, faculty & guests. "Proper" as defined by the Camp Board:

- Shorts at least fingertip length. No shorts or pants with rips or tears above the fingertips.
- No undergarments should be visible while worn; whether under, outside, or over clothing.
- Improper shirts for camp include sleeveless shirts, tank-tops, half-shirts, cut-outs (shoulder or back) or anything that is low-cut or revealing.
- Tight-fitting or revealing clothing of any type is not permitted.
- Swimsuits must be modest & must be covered completely by a dark t-shirt & shorts for males & females.
- Safe footwear must be worn at all times.
- No clothing with messages or pictures that does not promote Christ-like attitudes & actions will be permitted.

If someone chooses to not follow the Camp rules as stated above and those given by the Dean, he or she may be sent home at the Dean's discretion.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Campers will have lots of fun, meet new friends, and learn about Jesus!
- Campers will swim in the camp lake each afternoon, unless lightning is in the sky.
- The food is fantastic! If you have special dietary needs, let the kitchen staff know.
- Canteen will be open each day for campers to purchase drinks and snacks.
- The sleeping cabins are air conditioned. Showers and restrooms are a short walk from the cabins.
- Campers will clean up after themselves, change clothing, and take showers each day.
- Camp counselors and staff are adult Christians who are specially selected for their love and concern for children. They are committed to keeping campers safe.

The staff is prepared for every kind of situation and weather problem. Parents, please avoid calling or visiting during inclement weather.

Any child showing symptoms of a contagious disease will be sent home and all parents of campers will be notified of the occurrence.

- 1 or 2 pairs of tennis shoes (No flip flops on the field of play!)
- Swim suit
- Dark t-shirt and shorts for swimming (Boys and girls!)
- Bug spray (Fend off those little pests!)
- Flashlight (It gets dark in the woods!)
- Refillable water bottle
